
Kingfishers have had many



We have all undertaken research projects on a chosen UN goal thinking about how we can become inspiring change makers in the world. We also researched our DT moving toys before we built them.




Swallows enjoyed their course on being a playleader. They learnt how to organise games, encourage cooperation and lead a group of children too. They also learnt some new games to use in the playground.


