
The Clinton C of E Geography Update

We have explored how we use compass points to locate places and now moved on to exploring continents of the world. We will be exploring the equator and northern/southern hemispheres. Geography at The Clinton:

This half term we have had Geography as one of our driving subjects. This has allowed us to really focus in on securing geographical skills from previously taught sequences as well as now extending our learning and knowledge further. Our Early Years have focused on using location and positional language and learning about our skies at night. Key Stage One have been securing knowledge about the UK. Key Stage Two have been extending their knowledge of the UK and countries of the world.
